#### **NAME**

rat – run at with a classic ravtaalian date rrat – run at with a revised ravtaalian date

# **SYNOPSIS**

```
rat [ time ] mon date [ year ]
rrat [ time ] mon date [ year ]
```

### **DESCRIPTION**

rat is a thin wrappers around the at(1) command. It allows you to run at commands using either a classic or a revised Ravtaalian date. They do not fully support the flexible time notations of at, only month and date, in that order. You can also prefixed this with a time of day that at(1) can understand (it must be only one argument), without a specific time, the job will run at 12 AM. Finally, you can suffix the date with an optional year.

# **EXAMPLE**

rat 10am pla 20 echo remind me of something important (hit Control-D)
