

NAME

rat – run at with a classic ravtaalian date
rrat – run at with a revised ravtaalian date

SYNOPSIS

rat [*time*] *mon date* [*year*]
rrat [*time*] *mon date* [*year*]

DESCRIPTION

rat is a thin wrappers around the *at(1)* command. It allows you to run *at* commands using either a classic or a revised Ravtaalian date. They do not fully support the flexible time notations of *at*, only month and date, in that order. You can also prefixed this with a time of day that *at(1)* can understand (it must be only one argument), without a specific time, the job will run at 12 AM. Finally, you can suffix the date with an optional year.

EXAMPLE

```
rat 10am pla 20  
echo remind me of something important  
(hit Control-D)
```
